



## SSSC / SSSR Snow Poker Run Frequently Asked Questions

Q1: What are the stops this year?

A1: For the 2017 Snow Poker Ride, the following stops will be available:

- The Cove Marine and Recreation Center
- Foodland MacTier
- Six Star Trail Stop (trail 16)
- Petro Canada
- Rosseau Road Powersports and Marine
- South Sequin Trail Stop (trail 201 and Sequin trail)
- TBD (FINAL STOP)
- OTHERS TO BE ANNOUNCED

Q2: Is there an age restriction on the Snow Poker Ride?

A2: Yes, participants in the Snow Poker Run must be 18 years of age or older. Parents or guardians are welcome to carry more than one hand, but participants that are not 18 are not eligible to win. The reception and dinner at the Grand Tappattoo Resort is family friendly and all are welcome.

Q3: Is my card still valid if it is not signed?

A3: The card must be initialed or stamped by the official in order to qualify. There will be no exceptions.

Q4: What time does the Snow Poker Ride start and finish?

A4: The Snow Poker Ride starts at 9:00 am and all stops close at 4:00 pm, with the exception of the final stop which closes at 5:00 pm. The restaurant will host the reception beginning at 6:00 pm. Dinner follows the reception and begins at 7:00 pm sharp!

Q5: Can I draw all of my cards at the Final Stop?

A5: No, you must visit the appropriate stops in order to ensure that your card is initialed or stamped by an official.

Q6: Can I purchase my card at one of the Snow Poker Ride stops?

A6: There will be a very limited number of cards that can be purchased at the stops. It is recommended that you purchase early, as there are only 250 cards available. Don't be disappointed!

Q7: Where can I park at the restaurant on the evening of the event?

A7: We are assured by the resort that plenty of parking will be available. <u>Unsafe</u> parking will be tagged and towed at owner's expense.

Q8: What is the menu at the Restaurant?

A8: Your registration includes a wonderful buffet dinner. Menu items include:

- Slow Braised Roast Beef; Yorkshire Puddings; Assorted Bread
- Penne with Marinara; Garlic Roasted Potatoes
- Green Peas; Caesar Salad; Green Salad
- Dessert Assortment

Q9: How much does the Snow Poker Run cost?

A9: The \$60 preregistration fee includes a ticket to the event, plus your first and second hand. Up to four extra hands can be purchased (\$10 per hand), but do not include extra event tickets. Regular fee is \$75 and includes a ticket to the event and the first hand. Additional dinner tickets are available at \$30 each, (children

12 and under tickets are available at \$15 each) and is recommended that you contact Bill Park or Scott Gibson to ensure availability.

Q10: Where can I buy fuel while on the Snow Poker Run?

A10: It is recommended that you leave your staging area full of fuel; however, there are refuelling options on trail including Trail 8, Trail 16, and C103D / C Trail. Check your PSSD map for further details.

Q11: Where can I buy food while on the Snow Poker Run?

A11: There are several options on trail including Foodland MacTier (Trail 9 and follow signs), Trail 16, Trail 201 / C Trail, Trail 205, C103D / C Trail, and Trail 211 (which is minutes north of the Jolly Roger on C Alternate). Check your PSSD map for further details.

Q12: Where is Restaurant?

Q13: What are some of the silent auction items that will be available?

A13: The silent auctions items will include electronics, outdoor accessories, memorabilia, gift vouchers, etc. Don't forget that this is fundraising event supporting South Sequin Snowmobile Club and Six Star Snow Riders Club.

Q14: What clubs does this event support?

A14: This event supports South Sequin Snowmobile Club and Six Star Snow Riders Club.

Q15: What is the route?

A15: Unlike a typical Poker Run where you follow everyone around on one clubs trails and stop at the checkpoints in a predetermined order, the Snow Poker Run is more of an opportunity to actually tour the sponsoring club trails, and the only mandatory stop is the final stop (see Q1 for available stops). You choose your own route based on the stops.

Q16: I don't have a snowmobile, can I still participate?

A16: Yes, many stops are in place so that you can use a vehicle other than a snowmobile (see Q1 for available stops). You can also rent a sled! See Q24.

Q17: Can two people share a card?

Q17: The registration price includes dinner for ONE PERSON ONLY. If you choose to share a card to do the Snow Poker Run but both wish to attend the dinner you will have to buy an additional dinner ticket (see Q9 for ticket costs). Don't forget that this is fundraising event supporting South Sequin Snowmobile Club and Six Star Snow Riders Club.

Q18: What if I run out of time?

A18: Please keep in mind that this is NOT a race. Participants have from 9:00 am until 4:00 pm to complete the Snow Poker Run. Time is not a counted. The final stop closes at 5:00 pm.

Q19: Who do I speak to if I have an issue to discuss?

A19: You may direct your inquiries to the official at the stop. If it can't be resolved to your satisfaction, please speak with Bill Park or Scott Gibson. Any decision made by SSSC / SSSR will be considered final. Remember, we are here to have fun!

Q20: Do I need a valid OFSC permit to be on the trails during this event?

A20: Yes, you need a valid OFSC permit, valid insurance, valid vehicle registration, and valid operator registration to participate in the Snow Poker Run. OPP, STOP, and Trail Patrols will be out in full force ensuring that this event is safe and compliant.

As this event falls on the Family Day Weekend (Try Our Trails Permit), trails are expected to be busy! You can download your "Try Our Trails Permit" from OFSC website.

Q21: When is the Snow Poker Run officially over?

A21: The Snow Poker Run is officially over when you complete the final stop or by 5:00 pm.

Q22: What if I have registered and paid but can no longer participate, can I have a refund?

Q22: No, refunds will not be permitted. Don't forget that this is fundraising event supporting South Sequin Snowmobile Club and Six Star Snow Riders Club.

Q23: I want to volunteer for this event and other club events. Who do I speak to?

Q23: Volunteers are always welcome, especially high school students who require volunteer hours to graduate. Please speak to your local club representative for further details. For this event, please speak with Bill Park or Scott Gibson.

Q24: I need to rent a snowmobile? Is there a local company that I can contact and make arrangements?

Q24: Yes, if you need to rent a snowmobile, please contact Rosseau Road Powersports & Marine. <u>Click here for further details</u>. Book early as rentals are first come first served basis!
